THE INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL REPORT

Highlighting the importance of autonomous colleges, the UGC document on the XII Plan Profile of Higher Education in India clearly states that: "The only safe and better way to improve the quality of undergraduate education is to delink most of the colleges from the affiliating structure. Colleges with academic and operative freedom are doing better and have more credibility. The financial support to such colleges boosts the concept of autonomy."

Autonomous colleges are free to make use of the expertise of university departments and other institutions to frame their curricula, devise methods of teaching, examination and evaluation. Sadakathullah Appa College was granted Autonomy in the year 2008. The status of autonomy has been effectively utilised by the institution ever since the conferment. successful first review in 2011-12, the college went for the second review. A four member team nominated by the UGC comprising of Prof. S.K. Singh, Former Vice Chancellor, Hemwati Nandan Bahuguna Garwak University; Prof. J.S. Bhat, Department of Physics, Karnataka University; Dr. Y. Ashok, Principal, Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan's Vivekananda College of Science Humanities and Commerce (Autonomous), Telangana; Dr. C. Pandiammal, Regional Joint Director of Collegiate Education, Tirunelveli; Dr. K. Senthamarai Kannan, Professor and Research Director, Department of Statistics, Manonmaniam Sundaranar University and Shri Umakant Baluni, Section Officer, University Grants Commission, New Delhi, visited our college for spot inspection on 11.07.2018, 12.07.2018 and 13.07.2018. The Standing Committee of the University Grants Commission in its meeting held on 31.07.2018 granted the extension of autonomous status to our College with effect from 2018-2019 to 2022-2023.

Our neighbouring state Kerala was badly affected by the unprecedented floods in August this year. With a view to offering a helping hand to our neighbours, relief materials worth Rs. 10,00,000/- were collected by our Students' Council Representatives and Student Volunteers. Alhaj. M.K.M.

Mohamed Nazar, Executive Committee Member, College Managing Committee, contributed relief materials worth Rs.1,00,000/-. Shanthi Nagar Muslim Jamath contributed relief materials worth Rs. 75,000/- and Alhaj T.E.S Fathu Rabbani, Secretary and Correspondent of our College Managing Committee provided a vehicle to distribute the collected materials. The materials were handed over to the District Collector, Pathanamthitta by our Principal on 24.08.2018.

The Career Guidance and Placement Cell of Sadakathullah Appa College, "We are Your Voice", a service organization and the District Employment Office jointly organized a Mega Job Fair for the differently abled persons on 29.07.2018. Tirunelveli District Collector Tmt. Shilpa Prabhakar Satish inaugurated the Job Fair.

In its October 23, 2018 edition, *The Hindu Tamil* Daily has recognized the yeoman service rendered by our college for 47 years by highlighting the important features of our college. It also appreciated the schemes such as Earn While You Learn, Student Help In First Aid (SHIFA), Student Self Help Scheme (SSHS), *Manitham*, etc. It recognised the students of our college with various titles. Viswanath Prathap Singh of III B.A. English has been given the title 'Young Genius', P. Mohamed Samsudeen of III B.Sc. Nutrition and Dietetics has been given the title 'Future Leader', Srinisha of II B.Com. has been titled as 'Young Artist' and Subbulakshmi of II B.A. History has been named as the 'Star Athlete'.

In the 28th Manonmaniam Sundaranar University Inter-Collegiate Athletics Meet- 2018-2019 held at Anna Stadium from 24.10.2018 to 26.10.2018, our college Athlete P.Sobiya III B.Sc. Physics created a record in the event Heptathlon with 3338 points and M.Manju of II B.A History created a record in the event Pole Vault by jumping 3.2 metres. The Men's and the Women's Athletic Teams won the Overall Championship 2018-2019 consecutively for the second time in the history of Manonmaniam Sundaranar University.
