REPORT OF THE INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL

The IQAC of our college channelizes all efforts and measures of the institution towards promoting its holistic academic excellence. In this view the IQAC of our college aims at developing a system for conscious catalytic improvement in the overall performance of the institution. The IQAC of our college strives to provide a good environment for learning. It envisages giving Quality in all the ventures undertaken by the institution. The IQAC gives more emphasis on revising the curriculum with a focus on need-based courses and global trends. It focuses on introducing inter-disciplinary, job-oriented and skill-based courses. It also focuses on preserving to select the subjects of their interest, introducing socially relevant extension programmes and implementing feedback mechanism.

The reaccreditation of the NAAC III cycle to our college was valid up to 14th November 2020. Due to reasons such as COVID – 19 Pandemic, the lockdown, Tamil Nadu Assembly and Local Body Elections and the Circular from the RJD Office dated 29.04.2021 (insisting the institutions not to mandate the staff to come to college during the Pandemic times), the submission of IIQA was not possible. Since the lockdown is lifted and normalcy assumes back, it will be feasible to submit the IIQA in the first week of December and subsequently the NAAC SSR within the next 45 days.

AQAR for the Academic Year 2019 – 2020 was submitted on 15.09.2021. A total of six sensitizations Programmes were organized by the IQAC in connection with the Preparatory work for the NAAC reaccreditation process. A total of 31 meetings were organized by the IQAC with the criterion-wise Conveners and members and other faculty regarding the preparatory measures for the submission of the NAAC SSR. The Criterion-wise conveners, with the able support of the members have completed 80% of the SSR Preparation. They will complete the task within the first week of December.

As a part of Quality Initiatives, the IQAC has conducted a Faculty Development Programme on ‘Goal Setting and a Webinar on ‘Research and Innovation; Challenges and Opportunities for which Dr. M. Hussain Basha, Psychologist, NLP specialist, Master Mind Consultraining, Chennai and Dr. Krishnan Baskar, Director, CTDT, Anna University were the resource persons respectively. A total of 46 Webinars / Symposia / Workshops / Faculty Development Programmes have been organized by the Departments of our institution. Webinars organized by the Departments from June 2021 to July 2021.

The Academic and Administrative Audit was held for the Administrative Office, Library, IQAC and Part V activities on 08.11.2021 and for all the Departments on 13.11.2021. Dr. V. Balamurugan, Director IQAC, Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli and Dr. William Dharma Raja, Dean, Faculty of Education, Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli served as the External Auditors.

The Green Audit was held on 17.11.2021. Mrs. Ar. Nahida Shaikh , Greenvio Solutions, Palghar District, Maharashtra served as the External Auditor. A live tour of the college premises and online live interview sessions were conducted as part of the Audit.

5. It was resolved to purchase Braille Software for Visually Challenged students.
6. It was resolved to construct separate toilets for physically challenged with all amenities.

8. It was resolved to initiate the establishment of Sadakath Medical Lab and Diagnostic Centre.

Annexure III

Report of Dr. V. Balamurugan, Director IQAC regarding the Administrative Audit on 9th November 2021

1. The administrative office is well organized and there exists a fair system to carry out all activities. However, its functionality can be optimized by the following:
 - a. File disposal needs to be improved. The retention period of documents needs to be defined and the non effective documents needs to be destroyed by constituting a board.
 - b. Hard copy documents related to admission needs to be maintained as it will be useful in case of system failure.
 - c. Centralized / Master stock register needs to be maintained for computer systems and other equipment's.
 - d. On job training needs to be provided to the office staff members in the areas of SR Maintenance, Private College Regulation Act, Office Procedures, etc. Further, suitable staff-incharge may be identified during the absence of the Office Superintendent. Organogram may be displayed in the office. The short signature of the Superintendent is needed in the office related matter under the principal's signature.

2. The activities of Part 5 cells / clubs are satisfactory and the supporting documents for the claimed activities needs to be authentic.
3. The library is well organized and its usage needs to be optimized by analyzing the visitors' book so that the frequently and infrequently read books are identified. Further the budget allocation for the library plays a major role in the NIRF Ranking and NAAC Accreditation. Therefore budget for library may be allocated as per the UGC Guidelines on Terms and Conditions of Affiliation of colleges by a University. (i.e. not less than Rs. 3000 per subject per year for purchase of books). Library Committee may decide the books to be purchased. Librarian may be assigned with the responsibility of collecting statistics on the college's research progress.
4. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell is well established and several quality initiatives have been made. The quality initiatives may be displayed on the walls.

**Report of Dr. V. Balamurugan, Director IQAC
regarding the Administrative Audit
on 13th November 2021**

I hereby submit a report on the academic audit that was conducted on 13th November 2021 in the following departments:

1. Department of Zoology
2. Department of Physics
3. Department of Chemistry

4. Department of Computer Science
5. Department of Library and Information Science.

From the reports submitted by the departments, it is evident that the departments have made reasonable contribution to the growth of the college. Most of the reported activities have valid supporting evidences. However, still there is a scope for improvements. The following suggestions are made to optimize the quality.

- a. The changes in the syllabus contents and introduction of new courses may be highlighted so that anyone can understand them easily. Further the details such as percentage of changes carried out, ratio of Core, Elective, Interdisciplinary, employability courses may be made available.
- b. The registers such as Staff Meeting Register and BOS register may be wrapped neatly along with name of the register, certificate paragraph, date of opening and closing, page numbers, etc. Pasting of papers and leaving empty pages in the registers may be avoided. The minutes shall contain date and time of meeting, venue, members present / in-absentia, agenda items, resolutions, signature of the members, etc.
- c. The Programme specific outcomes and course outcomes shall be specific, measurable, achievable, relevant and time bound. It may be clearly defined with action verbs of higher order learning along with mapping and evaluation schema.

- d. The lesson plan shall contain academic calendar, time table, extended syllabus, plan of conducting the class, etc. The syllabus coverage must be hand written.
- e. Alumni activities need to be improved to track the progress of outgoing students.
- f. Syllabus coverage and result analysis can be discussed in the staff meeting.
- g. Ventilation in the chemistry lab may be improved by installing an exhaust fan.

Invited Academic Auditor's Report

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Date of Auditing: 13.11.2021

Audit on: Departments of Arts

I. Visible Green Side:

1. Majority of teachers have real desire to tone up their Departments and hence the College
2. Some Departments maintain the Appointment Orders for authenticating the Placement services
3. MoUs by the Departments with local Colleges
4. No repetitive research works for the PG projects
5. Various Specialisations in BBA Department

6. Strength of sports activities in Department of History
7. 60 students from other Departments are attracted by the Department of History for a Certificate programme

II. Auditor as a Well-wisher of the College:

A. To HoDs:

1. All the Department level minutes should be signed by the HoD and the members.
2. All the e-resources by ALL the Departments are to be uploaded. Record for activities of launching and link details to be maintained. This may be placed in the Department Notice board.
3. When a record/document is asked for verification it has to be submitted as soon as possible. Two Departments didn't take such requests seriously.
4. The 'project' also to be added with the number of courses.
5. All the data should be kept in hard copies (Many try to show their mobile screens and waste everyone's time).
6. The HoD should be thorough with all the data (like % of modification in the new curriculum, no. of students in the Department, no. of teachers in the college – aided and unaided, mission of the college, etc.).
7. Event files are not maintained properly. It should carry
 - a. Flyer
 - b. Invitation Card
 - c. Invitation letter to Resource Persons
 - d. Profile of RPs (one pg. each) with photo
 - e. 2 pages report of the event

- f. Participants list with sign
 - g. Sample copy of certificate
 - h. A CD with PPTs by RPs
 - i. First 5 pages of proceedings (if any)
 - j. Feedback forms (5-10)
 - k. Thanking letters to RPs
8. HoD's profile should be very impressive.
 9. All the profiles must be signed by the teacher concerned and countersigned by the HoD.
 10. List of NET cleared PG students may be kept in the Departments.
 11. Highlighter may be used to distinguish the similar or changed contents of the old and new curriculum.
 12. The data mentioned by same Departments of aided and unaided streams should be the same.

B. To Teachers:

1. The support and actions by all the teachers of the Department is to be tangible to the visitors while they ask for data/files.
2. It is not difficult to be a member of a professional body by each faculty.
3. Involvement by all the teachers is to be expressed tangibly, during visit.
4. The teachers may use "yes to" instead "No" for relevant/possible tasks, if they don't have.

5. Teachers' tables, top of the bureaus, shelves etc. to be arranged/organised properly.
6. For publications, showing certificates may be avoided; instead the wrapper, content page, first page of the article are to be shown.
7. Original Hard copies of the Journals, if available or Colour print outs are to be displayed in the Department.
8. Signatures, above the title by all teachers.
9. The teachers may be encouraged to publish the PG project works also, at least a few for each year by each PG Department. The Department of English can do it very easily. It need not be restricted to CARE-listed journals only.
10. Teachers should know the difference between SLOs and e-content, the 4 quadrants of e-content, difference between the article and journal, difference between ISBN and ISSN, difference between publication in proceedings and journals, expansions for NAAC, NPTEL, MOOC, CARE, the names of current CARE listed journals in their discipline, Vision of the College, Mission of the Department, full names of all the teachers and their specialisation. Strengths (Unique to the Department) & challenges (many are weak in pronouncing) and future plan for the Department.

11. Some teachers have put no effort to file the table B, which are so easy like

- a. Papers in conference proceedings (Annexure - 12)
- b. Placement details (p. 14)
- c. Higher Studies details (p. 14)
- d. Webinars attended (Annexure XIV – 2)
- e. Serving as Resource Persons (Annexure – 8)

C. To IQAC:

1. The college diary/calendar should be provided to all the VT members.
2. Names of the value added courses and 'employability' courses may be pronounced by all the Departments, for which the pivotal committee of the college may help.
3. Some Departments have no Desktops and working printer.
4. Name Board should carry only existing Staff in the college.
5. Staff Name board is to be provided to all the teachers.
6. Some Departments claim for Department level Alumni meeting. If they could do something great for the Dept/ College, let them be allowed.
7. Department level library is a suggestion, at least in the future.
8. All the events (invitations) during the assessment period may be displayed in a board – either for the whole College (or) for each Department.
9. The significant works like awards, project orders, high quality publications may be filed as colour print outs/ in royal executive bond sheets.

10. Some teachers with PhD didn't publish even a single paper in the last 22 months (In a Department of 5 PhDs, 3 didn't publish anything. In other words 60% of the teachers didn't do anything for publications). This has to be treated very seriously, but not harshly.
11. The first page of the profile of teachers may be designed by the College (with their photo).
12. Profile of all the teachers is a must. Some teachers who are in ML, long leave have not submitted their profile.
13. Let the Department of Tamil and Department of Arabic have the display boards in Tamil and Arabic respectively in addition to the boards in English.
14. The HoDs' table may be distinguished by some means like a table spread uniformly in all the Department, or Name boards in unique colour (say green/red).
15. All the books published may be presented in the hard bound form, which will enhance the tone of publication.
16. The usage of 'Xerox' to be avoided.
17. Best Slide shares/e-content may be presented as colour hard copies (Two per Department).
18. Uniqueness of each Department should be focussed – filed in elite form. For example

- i. Department of History – Keeladi Visit, Wall journal.
- ii. Department of English – Plagiarism check of PG project works.
- iii. Department of Arabic – student from other regions.
- iv. Department of Tamil – every year publication of *ftpij E}y*;

Other Suggestions:

1. Visitors Record for Alumni may be maintained at the Department
2. PG and Research Departments may maintain hard copy of current UGC listed journals

Apart from Academic:

1. The Vice-Principal's room as the first room at the entry point is not impressive.
2. Department notice boards may be painted - same colour in the whole college.
3. For such auditing, it is better to invite 4 experts – 2 for Science & 2 for Arts. One auditor will be mere silent observer, who could give in-depth inputs
4. Separate rest rooms for faculty, including the first floor.
5. Polythene bags in the faculty rooms are to be avoided for any purpose
6. Broom container may be provided nearby each wash basin.
