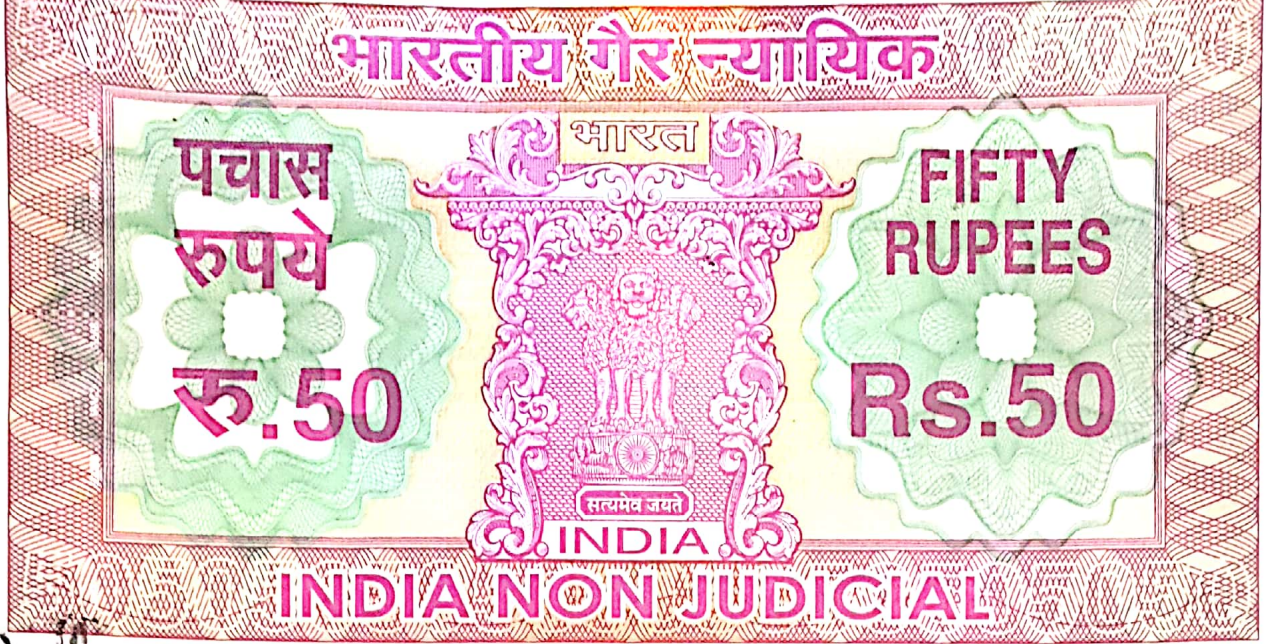

I. Preamble


Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous) (hereafter **SAC, Rahmath Nagar, Tirunelveli – 627 011, Tamil Nadu, India**), accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), an accrediting agency recognized by the Ministry of human Resource and Development (MHRD), INDIA, and **Wollega University** (hereafter **WU**), an institution of higher learning established under the FDRE higher education proclamation No.650/2009 Article 6, located in Oromia region, East Wollega zone Nekemte Town Kebele 07 here after referred as WU Po Box 395; Tele +251578619056; Fax 251576617980; email; wu@ethionet.com

Purpose and Scope


Article I.1

This Academic Collaboration recognizes the goodwill that exists between both parties, to enter into an academic form of collaboration for the purpose of offering educational services to students at the Postgraduate, Doctoral and Post-Doctoral levels, including non-traditional forms of formal and informal education.

The subject of this agreement is academic collaboration between the parties in the activities as mentioned hereafter. Further types of collaboration that are to be established will be set forth in separate agreements.

II.Duration

Article II.1

Both parties are willing to establish and maintain long-term multilateral collaboration in both academic and non-academic affairs. This collaboration will become effective on the date of signing for a period of five years and can be renewed by mutual consent. Either institution has the right to initiate termination of this agreement with no less than 30 days notification to the other institution.

III. Common Provisions


Article III.1


The present agreement for academic collaboration will govern academic cooperation between the **Wollega University** and **Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous)** for recruitment, credit transfer, and student exchange leading to award of **Masters of Science in Chemistry** degree. This agreement does not preclude the necessity to adopt adhoc agreements related to the mobility of students, faculty and researchers outside of the framework of this agreement.

Article III.2

All agreements are governed by a principle of general equality between both parties. Such a principle is applicable to an individual's mobility between both institutions. The hosting of international students will occur under the legal and immigration requirements of the host country.

Either institution has the right to initiate termination of this agreement with 30 days written notice.

Article IV.1

Article IV.2

V. Methods and Modes of International Student Exchange

Recognition of Academic Achievement and Learning

Article V.1

Students from both the institutions will have the opportunity to spend at least one or more semesters at the other host university. Academic credits earned will be fully transferable where applicable within the provisions provided by this agreement. The overall number of credits that can be transferred to the host university will vary according to University manuals for transfer of academic credits. When transferring credits, both institutions agree to comply with the requirements of their accrediting and regulatory agencies.

Transcripts

Article V.2

Each institution will maintain standardized academic records of their enrolled students in the exchange programs and provide the partner institution with official documents for student enrollment, academic progression, transfer, or degree-certificate completion. International students that decide to enroll into the Master's degree programs are obliged to supply official student transcripts and/or diplomas in their official language of instruction.

Academic Credit Transfer

Article V.3


In recognition of the excellence of teaching that exists at both the college and university, SAC and WU agree to maximize the opportunities for mobility of students between them by facilitating the transfer of credits earned at their institutions.

This collaboration is based on recognition that the academic expectations and assessment regimes at **Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous)** and **Wollega University** are comparable and transferable.

1. Credit will be granted to students who are accepted for admission into a degree program at one university for appropriate units of courses successfully completed while enrolled at the other university.
2. A minimum of a 3.0 grade point average ("B") out of 4.0 must have been earned on all graduate-level transferable credits.

3. Credit transfer will be available to students in all degree programs who have successfully completed a recognized component of study at SAC or WU.
4. Transferring students will be required to complete a minimum of 50% of the relevant degree program in the university from which they graduate.
5. Students must meet all requirements of the degree program in which they enrol.
6. Credit transfer for units of study successfully completed as part of a previously completed degree will be considered in accordance with the rules of the degree program into which the student is seeking admission.

Degree Articulation
Article V.4

SAC and WU will implement an exchange program at the **Masters of Science in Chemistry level**. Students will spend the first year at their home university and their fourth semester of the second year at the other university. For example, a student enrolled in Wollega University will spend their first year of study at Wollega University and their fourth semester of the second year at SAC. The final 50% (or higher) of credits towards the M.Sc. will be earned at the degree granting university.

The **Masters of Science in Chemistry** courses at SAC and WU have been mapped, or compared, to determine which courses are equivalent (see Appendix A). Students must take courses at the other university that have been determined to be equivalent. Under this agreement, SAC and WU will work to more fully synchronize their courses.

Further degrees in other academic areas will be set forth in separate collaboration agreements.


Financial Responsibility and Tuition Fees
Article V.5


Each institution reserves the right to its autonomy in financial matters that involve annual tuition, costs for courses per credit hour, awarding of scholarships, student loans, student discounts and other matters that involve payments by students.

Financial arrangements between both institutions with respect to student tuition, accommodation and other consequential costs will be set forth in a special agreement.

By separate agreements between both institutions, tuition can be covered and/or reduced by the host institution in a reciprocal manner or the student can

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present payment in kind to the university in forms that shall be agreed upon by the host university.

VI. Institutional Exchange

Faculty Exchange Article VI.1

Course instructor or faculty who meet specified conditions for exchange from both institutions will have the possibility of a sabbatical visit and an opportunity to engage in lectures for one or more semesters, provided that they receive a formal invitation from the authorities of that host university. This refers to the following categories of exchange:

- Faculty willing to teach at the partner institution
- Guest lecturers
- Part time lecturers for one or more semesters
- Part time lecturers for intensive courses delivered at each university
- Participation at conferences organized by both universities –with a waiver of conference fees
- Video conferencing and joint presentations through the internet

In instructor exchanges of a semester or more in length or where an entire course is taught, both institutions agree to comply with the requirements of the hosting institutions accrediting and regulatory agencies.

Financial arrangements regarding faculty financial assistance, accommodation and other costs will be set forth in a separate agreement.


Administration Exchange Article VI.2

Administrative staff members that fulfill specified conditions for exchange from both the institutions should have the opportunity to attend a full or partial semester at the expense of their home institution. This is offered to both institutions in order to improve and align administrative procedures for optimal performance. This should occur only by invitation from the host institution.

Financial arrangements regarding financial assistance, accommodation and other costs that are incurred with such forms of exchange will be set in a separate agreement.

VII. Legal Provision and Accreditation

Accreditation

Article VII.1

Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous), College is accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), an accrediting agency recognized by the Ministry of Human Resource and Development (MHRD), India

Wollega University (WU), an institution of higher learning established under the FDRE higher education proclamation No.650/2009 Article 6, located in Oromia region, East Wollega zone Nekemte Town Kebele 07, Ethiopia.

Representations of the Collaboration

Article VII.2

Both parties agree to comply with the requirements of their accrediting and regulatory agencies in providing accurate descriptions of the nature and scope of this academic collaboration. WU and SAC agree to seek prior approval from the other for any statements describing this academic collaboration and to comply with the terms of approval.

VIII. Amendments and Termination


Legal Relationship of the Parties

Article VIII.1


This agreement for collaboration does not constitute a joint business venture. Neither institution assumes any liability for the legal obligations of the other. Both institutions remain fully independent and autonomous in all financial and legal matters.

This Academic Collaboration may be amended or modified by written agreement of the parties involved. Any party may terminate the agreement by giving the other party no less than 30 days written notice.

By mutual consent through signing of this agreement, both parties/institutions, permit the use of their logos and trademarks in multiple applications (catalogs, brochures and other advertising literature) and other lobbying methods for the purpose of enrolling new students into the programs and exchange of students in the programs.

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Relationship after Termination
Article VIII.2

In the event of termination of this agreement, both institutions shall cease to use each other's names or trademarks in their catalogs and promotional literature. Each institution will not enroll any new students in any of the programs under the previous agreements between the two institutions. Enrollment of new students after termination of this agreement will be done without the benefits of the previous agreement. Students participating in the exchange program at the time of the termination will be permitted to complete the program to the end as if the agreement continued to be in full force and effect.

Miscellaneous provisions
Article VIII.3

This Academic Collaboration is signed in two equal copies, one for each party, in the English language. This agreement is not a legally binding document, but rather serves as a basis for other documents for collaboration. Both institutions remain fully independent and autonomous in all financial and legal matters.


Article VIII.4

Distribution of funds for the establishment of this Academic Collaboration has not been allocated. Any subsequent expenses incurred by this Academic Collaboration shall be covered by each party for their own part. This provision may be modified in subsequent agreements.


Both SAC and WU commit to, when appropriate opportunities arise, making use of their reasonable endeavor to secure funds and resources in order to meet the aims of the Academic Collaboration or the further subsequent specific agreement.

Entire Collaboration
Article VIII.5

This is the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior negotiations and agreements. Any changes to this collaboration must be in writing, and signed by both parties. Future agreements between SAC and WU that define the certificate programs in other fields and acceptance of complete or partial program completions will be based on mutual consent.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This memorandum of Understanding made on 9th October, 2014 by and between Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous), Tirunelveli - 627 011 and The School of Commerce, Palayamkottai, Tirunelveli - 627 002.

The School of Commerce approached the Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous) to impart Typewriting skill to the students and make them eligible to appear for the Typewriting examination conducted by the Directorate of Technical Education (DoTE), Government of Tamil Nadu. The Management of Sadakathullah Appa College agreed the proposal in the interest of the students.

On mutual discussion & consent, this Memorandum of Understanding is arrived and represented by Mrs. S. Anne Arockia Bhuvaneshwari, Proprietor of the School of Commerce and Dr. M. Mohamed Sathik, The Principal, Sadakathullah Appa College with the following terms & conditions were agreed upon.

Responsibilities of the School of Commerce Typewriting Centre

1. To conduct the typewriting course at the premises of college without disturbing the rules, regulations, dignity and the sanctity of the college in whatsoever manner.
2. To provide practical typing skill to the students for a minimum duration of 180 hours with the permission to avail emergency leave on prior intimation. In case of needy students, The School of Commerce may provide more practical classes to acquire adequate skill to appear for the examination.
3. Not to collect any amount of money either directly or indirectly from the students.
4. To provide adequate number of typewriting machines to impart the skill.
5. To arrange for adequate number of instructors for the conduct of the course.
6. To maintain the Students' attendance and the progress of the course and any other information under the mutual agreement with the Principal.
7. To maintain student's attendance with Master Signature.
8. To provide the typewriting model test periodically per week and to facilitate the students to appear for the Typewriting examination conducted by the Directorate of Technical Education (DoTE), Government of Tamil Nadu.
9. The working months Jan., Feb., Mar., Jun.(15 days), Jul., Aug., Sep., Oct.(15 days), Dec., Jan., Feb., (Ten months, Each month consisting of 15 to 20 working hours depending on the working days of the college)


Responsibilities of Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous)

1. To allow the Instructor/Instructors of The School of Commerce into the college premises to conduct the course.
2. To provide training accessories like Furniture, Blackboard, Chalk piece etc. as may be required.
3. To facilitate The School of Commerce in getting the course fee of Rs.120/- per month from each student before 10th of every month for a period of Ten months.
4. To facilitate The School of Commerce in the collection of the Examination Fee of ₹ 750 from each Student on the completion of 130 hours of the practical training.
5. To allow four wheeler and two wheeler inside the campus necessary for the conduct of the course.

PREAMBLE

SCOPE OF COOPERATION

2. SCC and SAC are in full agreement in exchanging their staff and students in matters related to teaching and learning for mutual growth and development.

4. SAC shall provide necessary assistance to the faculty and staff for their visits related to advice, training and implementation.

This agreement will take effect from the date of its signing and shall be valid for an unlimited period from that date unless sooner terminated, revoked or modified by mutual written agreement.

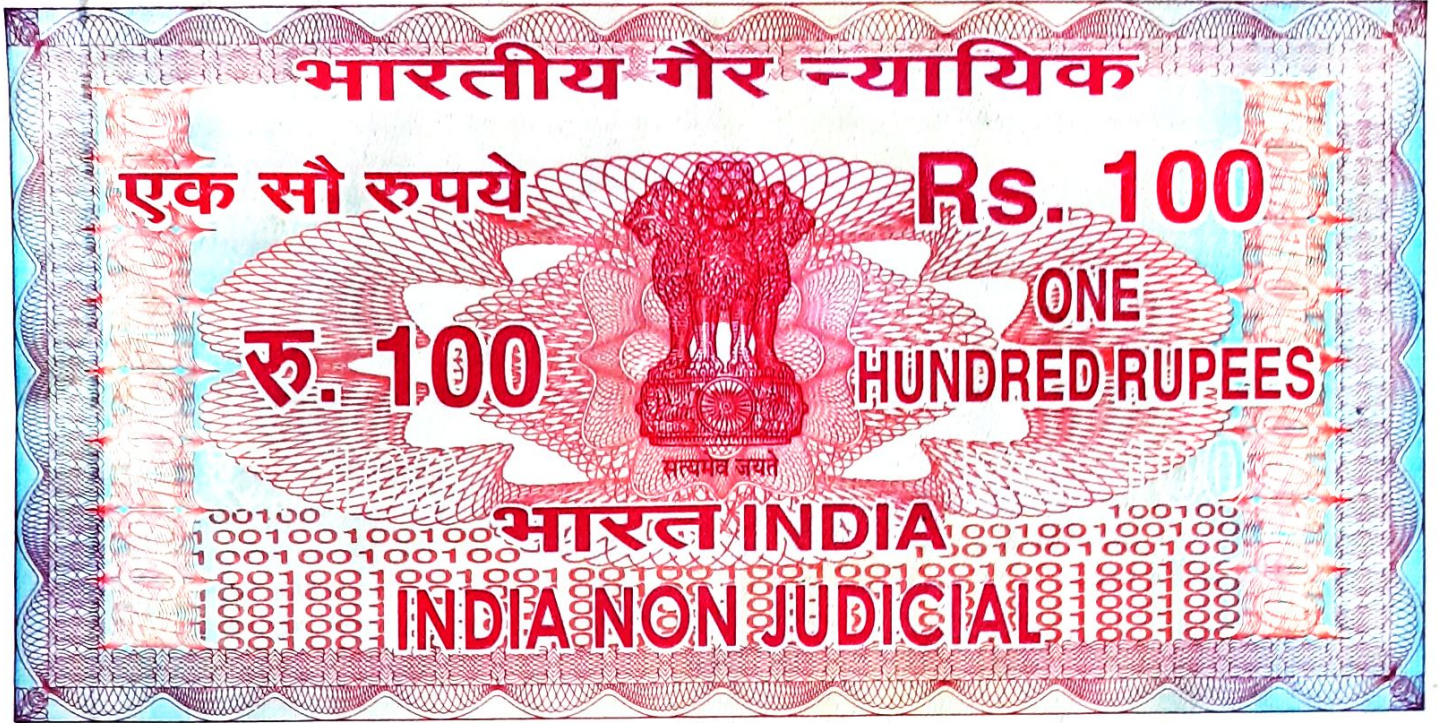

1. Preamble

St. John's College, Palayamkottai, the Oxford of south India, Tirunelveli, is one of the oldest and reputed institutions in Tamil Nadu.

2. Purpose

The purpose of the Memorandum of Understanding is to ensure Research & Development co-operation between Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous), and St. John's College, Palayamkottai and share the knowledge and skills available in both institutions. This Memorandum of Understanding will also take up joint Consulting and Projects to the Institution.

2.1 Sponsored Projects

Apart from providing training to the students, St. John's College, Palayamkottai, shall sponsor projects to the PG and Research Department of English in Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous) based on the research requirements of English Students. The cost will be decided at the time of project being sponsored by both the parties.

2.2 Projects

Two experts each from St. John's College, Palayamkottai and Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous), shall guide their research projects as and when required.

2.3 Research

The PG and Research Department of English in Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous) shall take the skills, expertise from St. John's College, Palayamkottai if necessary for carrying out various learning and teaching requirements.

2.4 Miscellaneous

In addition to the tasks discussed above, the collaboration shall also include the following:

- Interaction with the experts in the department concerned so as to pave the way for a knowledge platform for both faculty and students.
- Offering expert lectures from one side to the other.
- Offering valuable inputs to the institution as a feedback from the fellow institution in respect of recent trends and developments in the area of interaction.
- Offering guidance for suitable placement for students.
- Both the colleges shall exchange and cooperate in Placement Activities such as Soft Skills Training and On-Campus recruitment process.
- The libraries in both the colleges could be utilized by the PG students, scholars and faculty.
- The Student Exchange Program come into effect wherein students from St. John's College, Palayamkottai could receive expertise from faculty concerned of Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous), Tirunelveli, and vice versa.
- Faculty Exchange Program could be brought into action upon the signing of the authorities concerned. Faculty from St. John's College, Palayamkottai, render and share knowledge and expertise to faculty in Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous), Tirunelveli, and vice versa.

3 Exchange of Information and Documents



CENTRAL LIBRARY


COMMENCEMENT, RENEWAL, TERMINATION AND AMENDMENT
