



1. Preamble

2. Purpose

The purpose of the memorandum of understanding is to ensure various **Collaborative Quality Initiative Programmes** initiated by both the IQACs and measure their successful implementation between first and second party and share their knowledge and skills available in both the institutions for the benefit of enhancing the quality of teaching and learning. This Memorandum of Understanding will also take up joint Consultations and Projects to the Institution.

2.1 Sponsored Projects

Apart from providing training to the students, **the first party** shall sponsor projects to the UG, PG students in relevant and mutually interested areas and Research Departments of the second party. The cost will be decided at the time of project being sponsored by both the parties.

2.2 Projects

The first party and second party shall mutually offer research projects to the UG, PG and research scholars of belonging to both the institutions for a period mentioned therein sufficient to complete the project. Two experts each from St. John's College, Tirunelveli- 627 002 and Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous), Rahmath Nagar, Tirunelveli - 627 011 shall guide their research projects as and when required.

2.3 Research

Both parties shall share the skills, expertise wherever necessary for carrying out various learning and teaching requirements and *vice versa*.

2.4 Miscellaneous

In addition to the objectives discussed above, the collaboration shall also include the following:


- Interaction with the experts in the department concerned so as to pave the way for a knowledge platform for both faculty and students.
- Offering expert lectures from one side to the other.

- Both the colleges shall collaborate and cooperate in Placement Activities such as Soft Skills Training and On-Campus recruitment process.
- The libraries in both the colleges could be utilized by PG students, scholars and faculty of both the Colleges.
- Community Programmes: Social Awareness Events conducted for the rural community, Assistance of labour for a specific period and Health Awareness supplementing with recent medical Assistance could be carried out as Extension programmes.

The Mentor Institution through its IQAC shall identify the potential areas of improvement in assessment criteria i.e. Curricular Aspects, Teaching Learning & Evaluation, Research, Innovation & Extension, Best Practices so on and so forth. Further the mentor institution can guide the mentee institution to focus and guide their application procedure at different stages.

The Mentee Institution through its IQAC may undergo the complete Accreditation process with the help of the Mentor Institution in order to prepare themselves for the actual NAAC Assessment process.

The IQAC creates a Standing Committee where expertise can be pooled from multiple sources. The Committee shall work under the stewardship of an Accreditation Ambassador (AA) who could be provided a fellowship on the lines of Emeritus Fellowship.

Article 7 : TERMINATION

Either institution may terminate the MoU by giving written notice of six months in advance to other institution. Once terminated, neither SAC nor KGAC will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other institutions may suffer. However, SAC and KGAC will ensure that the provisions of this progress until their completion.

Article 8 : AMENDMENTS

The MoU may be amended or modified by a written agreement signed by the representatives of both institutions.

Article 9 : LEGAL EFFECT


Nothing in this MoU shall be construed as creating any legal relationship between the institutions. This MoU is a statement of intent to foster genuine and mutually beneficial collaboration.

SAC and KGAC welcome the establishment of this Memorandum for co-operation and jointly agree to the provisions as set out above.
