This Memorandum of Understanding will also take up joint Consultations and Projects to the Institution.

2.1 Sponsored Projects

Apart from providing training to the students, the first party shall sponsor projects to the UG, PG students in relevant and mutually interested areas and Research Departments of the second party. The cost will be decided at the time of project being sponsored by both the parties.

2.2 Projects

The first party and second party shall mutually offer research projects to the UG, PG and Research scholars of belonging to both the institutions for a period mentioned therein sufficient to complete the project. Two experts each from St. John's College, Tirunelveli- 627 002 and Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous), Rahmath Nagar, Tirunelveli - 627 011 shall guide their research projects as and when required.

Both parties shall share the skills, expertise wherever necessary for carrying out various learning and teaching requirements and vice versa.

2.4 Miscellaneous

In addition to the objectives discussed above, the collaboration shall also include the following:

- a. Interaction with the experts in the department concerned so as to pave the way for a knowledge platform for both faculty and students.
- Offering expert lectures from one side to the other.
- c. Offering valuable inputs to the institution as a feedback from the fellow institution in respect of recent trends and developments in the area of interaction.
- Offering guidance for suitable placement for students.
- e. Both the colleges shall collaborate and cooperate in Placement Activities such as Soft Skills Training and On-Campus recruitment process.
- f. The libraries in both the colleges could be utilized by PG students, scholars and faculty of both the Colleges.
- g. Community Programmes: Social Awareness Events conducted for the rural community, Assistance of labour for a specific period and Health Awareness supplementing with recent medical Assistance could be carried out as Extension programmes.
- The Student Exchange Program come into effect wherein students from St. John's College, Tirunelveli - 627 002 could receive expertise from faculty concerned in Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous), Rahmath Nagar, Tirunelveli - 627 011 and vice versa.
- i. Faculty Exchange Program could be brought into action upon the signing of the authorities concerned. Faculty from St. John's College, Tirunelveli - 627 002 render and share knowledge and expertise to faculty in Sadakathullah Appa College (Autonomous), Rahmath Nagar, Tirunelveli - 627 011 and vice versa.

3 Exchange of Information and Documents

Both the institutions shall arrange for the exchange of information and documents concerning matters of common interest.
